In 2019, our A level cohort achieved 100% pass rate and joined some of the best universities and organisations in the world. In 2017, over 50% of our students bound for university went to Russell Group universities, including SIX to Oxbridge.

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Curriculum

With almost 30 subjects on offer, students design their own learning path based on their skills, talents and aspirations.

Students are encouraged to select subjects relevant to interests, aptitude and their career ambitions. Most students study three subjects, with the option to take an Extended Project Qualification (EPQ). This is largely self-directed, and, as well as the chance to be creative, an excellent EPQ can give students the edge when it comes to that all-important UCAS or job application.

Teaching and Learning

Students are taught in small, focused groups across classroom and lecture spaces, including our Sixth Form Centre, with seminar rooms and well-equipped café bar.

Supported by our 40-strong team of experienced subject specialists, as well as by a personal Sixth Form tutor, students are encouraged to manage their time effectively, developing skills to take on to higher education and careers.

Subjects

Although most of the subjects we offer are at A level, we have a small, but growing number of vocational qualifications. Currently offered across Food & Nutrition, Science, Business and Sport, we have plans to introduce a broader vocational curriculum as demand grows, from both students themselves, and the industries they will eventually join.





Challenge and Endurance

Sponsored by the armed forces, Combined Cadet Force (CCF) provides a challenging environment that supports students as they develop self-reliance, resourcefulness and endurance skills.

Given the opportunity to be part of a Tri-Service Contingent (Army, Royal Navy and Royal Air Force), Sixth Formers concentrate on the leadership aspect of the cadet force world, where Seniors take responsibility for training younger cadets.

This has close links with the volunteering section of the DofE Gold Award Scheme, providing opportunities that support the achievement of Gold.

A nationally recognised scheme, The Duke of Edinburgh Award (DofE) inspires young people with a cultural and practical programme of exciting and adventurous activities. And as an operating authority for the Award Scheme, we're able to offer the opportunity of the Gold Award in the Sixth Form – and so our expeditions take us across the UK, from the wider reaches of the Dark Peak in Derbyshire, to The Lake District and the summits of the Welsh mountains.

We're located in 330 acres of beautiful North Nottinghamshire countryside, in a peaceful, rural location, yet incredibly accessible.


Located on the border with the National Trust's Clumber Park, we're just 15 minutes from junction 30 of the M1 and only 75 minutes from London, by train.
